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Better Roads, Better Business

The UK Government's recent announcement of a major road repair initiative is welcome news for the coach industry. With an additional seven million potholes set to be repaired in 2025, the plan promises safer, smoother journeys for passengers and reduced wear and tear on vehicles.

Park Lane Coach Parking

Transport for London (TfL) has issued a reminder to coach operators regarding the use of the northbound coach parking area on Park Lane. To ensure the safety of all road users, including cyclists, and to maintain smooth traffic flow, specific rules apply to this area. Here's what you need to know:


Northbound Coach Parking

- No Boarding or Alighting: Coaches are not permitted to load or unload passengers in the northbound coach parking bays, except in the two designated bays located to the rear of Apsley House.
- Bus Stop Restrictions: All northbound stops along Park Lane are restricted for use by local buses only. Coaches should avoid using these stops entirely.

Southbound Carriageway

- Set Down and Pick Up Only: Coaches may set down or pick up passengers on the southbound carriageway, but parking or waiting is not permitted.
- Dedicated Facility: A specific facility for coach set down and pick up is available next to The Dorchester hotel, providing a safe and convenient option for passenger transfers.

These restrictions are in place to enhance road safety, particularly given the proximity of the northbound coach parking to a cycle lane. Operators are encouraged to plan routes and schedules accordingly to avoid disruptions and ensure compliance with TfL's guidance.

A New Route

Across The Thames

TfL have announced that the Silvertown Tunnel, the first road tunnel project in London in over 30 years, is set to open on April, marking а significant infrastructure development for the capital. Designed to ease congestion at the Blackwall Tunnel, this new Thames the Greenwich crossing between Peninsula and Silvertown in east London is expected to shave up to 20 minutes off commutes.

The Blackwall Tunnel has long been a bottleneck, with frequent closures and delays causing disruption for operators. The addition of the Silvertown Tunnel, equipped with a modern design and two lanes in each direction, offers an alternative route that promises smoother traffic flow and enhanced resilience against disruptions.

Cyclists will be able to take advantage of a dedicated shuttle service through the tunnel and up to 21 zero-emission buses an hour will operate in each direction.

While tolls will apply to both the new tunnel and the existing Blackwall Tunnel, vehicles with 9 or more seats are exempt, although they must first be registered with TfL. This exemption underscores the importance of coaches as a sustainable and efficient mode of transport, particularly in urban environments.
