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Licence Changes Made Digital

The Office of the Traffic Commissioner (OTC) is taking significant steps towards modernisation with a move to digital-by-default services. From 31 January 2025, all changes to transport managers on an operator's licence must be made using the digital process available within the Vehicle Operator Licensing (VOL) system. As part of this transition, the traditional TM1 form will be withdrawn and no longer accepted after this date.

For operators with pending applications for new licences who wish to change the nominated transport manager, updates must be requested through the VOL self-service messaging facility. This streamlined process ensures that all changes are recorded and processed efficiently.

In addition to transport manager changes, the OTC will also require applications for licence type changes or licence surrenders to be made digitally through the VOL system from the same date. While most requests will need to follow this digital pathway, exceptions exist for Insolvency Practitioners, who will receive paper forms after a change in company status. Additionally, operators unable to surrender their licence online can still submit written requests.

The OTC recognises that some licence holders may require help with electronic services. A full assisted digital service will remain available to ensure all operators can comply with the new processes. For support, operators can contact the Licensing Office at:

Smart Tachographs Update

There has been a significant update concerning the retrofit requirements for smart tachographs in PSVs used for international journeys between the UK and the EU.



PSVs operating internationally are subject to AETR drivers' hours and tachograph rules. To align with these regulations, the UK government is working to amend legislation that will formally apply AETR requirements to PSVs on international journeys between the UK and the EU.

Once this legislation is amended, the previously communicated retrofit deadlines for smart tachograph 2 will no longer apply to PSVs.

In the meantime, DVSA has clarified that it will not enforce the requirement to retrofit smart tachograph 2 devices into PSVs until the legislative updates are in place.

Domestic journeys travelling solely within the UK remain unaffected.

ETA Fees and Airside Transit Exemption

On Thursday, 16th January 2025, the Government announced new measures relating to immigration fees and Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETAs). These changes are part of a broader effort to ensure the sustainability of the UK's migration and border system.

As part of a recent review, the Government intends to raise the cost of an ETA from £10 to £16. This fee adjustment aims to ensure that the migration and border system is adequately funded. The increase will take effect once the necessary parliamentary approvals are completed.

Eligible non-Europeans, who currently require an ETA to travel or transit through the UK, can still obtain one at the current cost of £10 until the fee change is implemented. Similarly, eligible Europeans, who will be able to apply for an ETA starting from 5th March 2025, will also pay the current fee of £10 until further notice.

Airside Transit Exemption

In response to feedback from the aviation industry, the Government has introduced a temporary exemption for passengers transiting airside—those who do not pass through UK border control—from requiring an ETA. This exemption primarily applies to Heathrow and Manchester Airports, the only UK airports offering transit facilities. This measure came into effect on 16th January 2025 and will be kept under review.

What This Means

- The current £10 fee for ETAs remains in place until parliamentary approval is secured for the increase.
- Airside transit passengers at Heathrow and Manchester Airports are temporarily exempt from ETA requirements.
